


## Brigadoon Speaks Up.....



"...in the State of Washington alone, there are 398,000 mobility impaired, and 226,000 hearing impaired individuals. This is only a small part of the services Brigadoon dogs provide help for, and a small part of the area that Brigadoon services."

The SCCC Vets Pod has partnered with the Brigadoon Service Dog training program out of Bellingham, WA. The dogs coming into the program are trained to be certified Service Dogs for combat wounded Veterans – at no charge. If one of the dogs does not find a match to a Veteran, it's possible that they may go to a person with physical or developmental disabilities, anxiety, Post-traumatic Stress



Brigadoon dogs will in the working mode most of the time (pups still gotta play!), and training will last up to one year at Stafford Creek Corrections Center. After that, they will spend an



additional year at another facility. The Service Dog's main function is to assist their human. SCCC staff and offenders are honored to be given the opportunity to be involved in this program, and assist in the training of these wonderful dogs. The Brigadoon Service Dog program supports a great cause and also provides some of our offenders with a marketable job skill when they are released.
